Essential Functions

Compliance and Reporting:

- Complies with and implements the School's policies and procedures, ensuring accurate data entry and updates in Biala systems.
- Responds promptly to work health and safety incidents, reporting, and compliance requirements to ensure student welfare.
- Attends staff meetings and collaborates with the Head of Education and colleagues as required.
- Prepares and submits reports and student data to the Head of Education in a timely manner.
- Maintains professional development and full teacher accreditation in line with NESA standards.

Team Collaboration:

- Actively participates in the school team, including attending regular staff meetings and professional development workshops.
- Works closely with Teacher Aides to provide instructional leadership and inform them about practices and programs.
- Designs and prepares educational resources, contributing to whole-school programming.
- Collaborates to create and implement a School-Wide Positive Behaviour Support plan that encourages students to set and monitor personal goals.

- Maintains student data, plans, risk assessments, and relevant documents to inform Positive Behaviour Supports.
- Develops annual Personalised Plans for each student focused on evidence-based goal achievement.
- Participates in annual Personalised Planning meetings with families and the Head of Education.
- Delivers the NSW Curriculum, differentiated to meet student needs.
- Plans and implements class and individual student programs that meet NESA standards and Biala's policy requirements.
- Prepares students for transitions to other settings and supports their participation in the local community.
- Keeps up-to-date student attendance records.
- Liaises with the First Aid Officer regarding student medication needs and monitors adherence to treatment plans.
- Responds appropriately in emergencies or crisis situations.
- Maintains student well-being by reporting potential child protection issues to Biala's Child Protection Representative in accordance with policies.
- Counsels students and recommends interventions or disciplinary actions in collaboration with the Head of Education.
- Plans and coordinates extracurricular activities, ensuring safe transportation for all students.

Work Health and Safety (WHS):

- Adheres to Biala's WHS Handbook and follows safe work practices.
- Wear personal protective equipment (PPE) as required.
- Operates equipment and machinery in line with Safe Operating Procedures outlined in the WHS Handbook.
- Capable of performing all physical requirements, including lifting and transferring individuals with physical disabilities as needed.
